

# Muncho Lake Winter Activities

Open year-round!

Welcome to our winter wonderland! Staying at the Northern Rockies Lodge allows you to experience winter activities in Muncho Lake Provincial Park and surrounding areas. Here are some suggestions:

- **Skating:** The Northern Rockies Lodge maintains an outdoor skating rink on frozen Muncho Lake. Bring your skates and hockey stick -there is a good chance you will find some likeminded guests at our lodge during your visit.
  - **Log Sauna:** The use of the Northern Rockies Lodge log sauna is free for our guests. Light a fire in the wood stove, warm up the cozy cabin and enjoy the relaxing warmth.
  - **Snow shoeing/cross country skiing:** Frozen Muncho Lake offers great vistas into the Muncho Lake valley. It takes approximately one hour to ski or snowshoe from the Northern Rockies Lodge past Macdonald campground, across to Honeymoon Island and south into the Back Bay, across a narrow spit of land then back to the lodge. For the more adventurous guest the abandoned Drogheda Lake road, the old mine road or even a trip up to the CN Tower offer outstanding day touring options.
  - **Snowmobiling:** Muncho Lake is your winter playground, bring your snow machine and explore the countless riding options the area offers.
  - **Hotsprings:** the Liard River Hotsprings are a short 35 minute drive from Muncho Lake. Combine a visit to the Hotsprings with a snowshoe hike to the Mineral Licks or Smith River Falls.
- Other activities: Cross Muncho Lake and enjoy a wiener roast on a open fire, get your daily exercise by walking one mile on our airstrip which we plough each winter on frozen Muncho (before you go on the airstrip please ask the front desk for the possibility of any flight activities).
